#### Why does Open Gardens/Jardins Ouverts have a tulip as it's logo?

When the association of Open Gardens/Jardins Ouvert was being formed in 2014 it was deemed important to have a logo. Logo is a word of Greek origin and was used in philosophy by Aristotle to describe structure and content of language. Later logo became to stand for 'definition and meaning' so a modern description would be for organisations to have a symbol to represent their products.

So how does a charitable fund-raising association symbolise their 'product'?

The founding president chose a simple hand holding four daisy type flowers. This was to symbolise Gardening and Giving in Partnership. This simple logo met with the pixel requirements of the webmaster at that time.



However, as time progressed, the developing Conseil felt it to be naïve, so at a meeting a Rose was suggested. However, a brief on-line research during the meeting found that the tulip was a symbol of giving and generosity. Since then, there are very many more sites on the web that may argue with that but that was what was voted for by the conseil members.

This, like many charities, demonstrates our need for nature and beauty when there are difficult times in our lives. For Marie Curie it is the daffodil, whilst the Bluet de France (cornflower) and the Poppy symbolise the remembrance of French and English soldiers and in the UK it is the Forget-Me-Not for Alzheimer's charity.

- Over the past three years, Open Gardens/Jardins Ouverts has proudly donated 7,500 euros to support "Le Rire Médecin."




We firmly believe that every euro contributes to bringing smiles to the faces of these resilient children.
